It grows under the ground -> Root. Read the job, then ask which part is in the right place to do it.

WHILE YOUR CHILD WORKS

- Exercise 2 is the one worth spending time on. Do it at the kitchen counter with the actual vegetables if you can - it takes five minutes and it will stick for years.
- Potato is the classic trap: it grows underground and is a stem, not a root. Plenty of adults get this wrong, so if your child does, that is not a sign of weakness.
- The last exercise needs a real plant. It is worth going outside for rather than answering from imagination, because EVS at this stage is meant to be about the world the child can actually see.
