Aarav added ₹10 + ₹5 and got ₹20. Check by adding again: $10 + 5 = 15$, not 20. The correct total is ₹15.

1) Aarav added ₹20 + ₹10 and got ₹40. What is the correct total?

2) Isha added ₹50 + ₹20 and got ₹60. What is the correct total?

3) Dev added ₹5 + ₹5 + ₹2 and got ₹10. What is the correct total?

4) Zara added ₹10 + ₹10 + ₹10 and got ₹20. What is the correct total?

5) Rohan added ₹50 + ₹50 and got ₹90. What is the correct total?

2) An autorickshaw fare is ₹30. Kabir has a ₹20 note and a ₹10 note. Is that enough to pay exactly ₹30?

3) For Diwali, Meera's mother spends ₹50 on sweets and ₹20 on diyas. How much does she spend in total?

Which uses fewer pieces to make ₹30: three ₹10 notes, or one ₹20 note and one ₹10 note? Count the pieces: three ₹10 notes is 3 pieces; one ₹20 note and one ₹10 note is 2 pieces. Both make ₹30, but the second way uses fewer pieces.

1) Which uses fewer pieces to make ₹60: one ₹50 note and one ₹10 note, or six ₹10 notes? How do you know?

2) Is ₹45 the same amount as four ₹10 notes and one ₹5 coin? How do you know?

3) Which is greater, three ₹20 notes or one ₹50 note and one ₹20 note? How do you know?

4) Can you make ₹8 using only ₹2 coins? How do you know?

5) Is one ₹50 note worth more than five ₹10 notes? How do you know?

6) Which uses fewer pieces to make ₹22: two ₹10 notes and two ₹1 coins, or one ₹20 note and one ₹2 coin? How do you know?

7) Is ₹99 greater than ₹100? How do you know?

7. Answer in a full sentence, explaining how you worked it out.

- 1) The ₹50 note and ₹10 note use fewer pieces - that is 2 pieces, while six ₹10 notes is 6 pieces, and both add up to ₹60.
- 2) Yes, because $10 + 10 + 10 + 10 + 5 = 45$.
- 3) One ₹50 note and one ₹20 note is greater, because $50 + 20 = 70$, and three ₹20 notes = 60.
- 4) Yes, four ₹2 coins make ₹8, because $2 + 2 + 2 + 2 = 8$.
- 5) No, they are equal - one ₹50 note and five ₹10 notes are both worth ₹50.
- 6) One ₹20 note and one ₹2 coin uses fewer pieces - just 2 pieces - while the other way needs 4 pieces, and both make ₹22.
- 7) No, ₹99 is less than ₹100, because 99 comes just before 100 when counting.
- 8) One ₹100 note is greater, because four ₹20 notes = 80, and 80 is less than 100.
- 9) Yes, a ₹10 note and a ₹5 coin make ₹15, because $10 + 5 = 15$.
- 10) Neither - they are equal. Two ₹50 notes and one ₹100 note are both worth ₹100.

WHILE YOUR CHILD WORKS

- This sheet never goes above ₹100 and never uses paise - Class 1 stops at ₹100, and paise is a Class 2 topic only.
- Real coins and notes work far better than pictures. Let your child physically count out each amount before writing a total.
- The “make this amount” questions are the hardest on the sheet - there can be more than one correct way, so accept any combination that totals correctly.
