- 1) Answers will differ for every child.
- 2) Answers will differ - saying thank you, not littering, greeting them politely are all correct.
- 3) So that we stay healthy, do not fall ill, and everyone can use the streets comfortably.
- 4) Answers will differ - any helper, with a reason, is correct.
- 5) Answers will differ - a doctor, nurse, police officer, security guard or night bus driver are all correct.
- 6) Because we depend on all of them. If even one stopped, something we need every day would not happen.
- 7) Answers will differ - the sweeper, the ayah, the gardener, the security guard or the cook are all correct.
- 8) Rubbish would pile up, flies and rats would come, and people would fall ill.

WHILE YOUR CHILD WORKS

- Tools make jobs memorable at this age. If a helper is hard to recall, ask what they hold rather than what they do - the answer usually follows.
- Worth being careful with the cleanliness questions: the point is that everyone's work has value, not that some jobs are lesser. Children pick up the framing more than the facts here.
- The last exercise is conversation rather than assessment. A child who noticed a helper this week has understood the topic better than one who can list ten from memory.
