HERE'S ONE DONE FOR YOU

₹80 and 30 paise + ₹15 and 20 paise -> add rupees first: $80 + 15 = 95$. Then add paise: $30 + 20 = 50$ paise. So the total is ₹95 and 50 paise.

HERE'S ONE DONE FOR YOU

₹95 and 40 paise – ₹35 and 20 paise → subtract rupees first: $95 - 35 = 60$. Then subtract paise: $40 - 20 = 20$ paise. So the answer is ₹60 and 20 paise.

The hour hand points at 4 and the minute hand points at 12 - that is 4 o'clock. If the hour hand is between 4 and 5 with the minute hand at 6, that is half past 4.

1) The hour hand points at 4 and the minute hand points at 12. What time is it?

2) The hour hand points between 7 and 8, and the minute hand points at 6. What time is it?

3) The hour hand points at 9 and the minute hand points at 12. What time is it?

Exercise 4 of 7 · 10 questions Each reading below is wrong. Write the correct time.

WRITE THE ANSWER

HERE'S ONE DONE FOR YOU

Priya says a clock with hour hand between 9 and 10, minute hand at 6, reads 9 o'clock. That's wrong - it reads half past 9, because the minute hand at 6 with the hour hand between two numbers always means half past.

1) Riya says the clock showing hour hand at 5 and minute hand at 12 reads half past 5. Is she right? If not, what is correct?

2) Karan says the clock showing hour hand between 2 and 3, minute hand at 6, reads 2 o'clock. Is he right? If not, what is correct?

3) Simran says a clock with hour hand at 9 and minute hand at 12 reads 12 o'clock. Is she right? If not, what is correct?

4) Aman says the clock showing hour hand between 6 and 7, minute hand at 6, reads 7 o'clock. Is he right? If not, what is correct?

5) Zara says a clock reading half past 10 has the minute hand at 12. Is she right? If not, what is correct?

6) Yusuf says a clock reading 8 o'clock has the hour hand between 8 and 9. Is he right? If not, what is correct?

7) Ira says the clock showing hour hand at 11, minute hand at 12, reads half past 11. Is she right? If not, what is correct?

8) Farhan says half past 3 has the hour hand pointing exactly at 3. Is he right? If not, what is correct?

CIRCLE THE ANSWER

HERE'S ONE DONE FOR YOU

A shape with no corners and no sides, perfectly round, like a chapati - that is a Circle.

1) A shape with 3 sides and 3 corners.

2) A shape with 4 equal sides and 4 corners.

3) A shape with no corners and no sides, perfectly round.

4) A shape with 4 sides where opposite sides are equal, but all four sides are not.

5) A solid shape like a ball.

6) A solid shape like a box, with 6 flat faces.

7) A solid shape like a dice, with 6 equal square faces.

8) A solid shape like a can of juice, with two flat circles and one curved side.

9) A solid shape like an ice-cream cone, with one flat circle and one pointed tip.

10) A flat shape with 3 corners, seen in a samosa.

11) A round flat shape, seen in a chapati.

12) A flat shape with 4 corners and opposite sides equal, seen in a door.

HERE'S ONE DONE FOR YOU

Rohan has ₹120. He buys a ball for ₹75. Rupees only, so subtract directly: $120 - 75 = 45$. He has ₹45 left.

1) Amit has ₹250. He buys a toy for ₹120. Does he have enough left to also buy a book for ₹90? How much would remain?

2) A clock shows half past 7 in the evening. Priya's tuition class starts at 8 o'clock. How many half-hour spaces are there between half past 7 and 8 o'clock?

3) Neha has ₹36 and 40 paise. Her mother gives her ₹15 more. Does she now have enough to buy a pencil box worth ₹50? How much extra or short?

4) A wall clock and a table both have flat faces. Which shape best describes the clock's face - circle or rectangle?

5) A biscuit box is shaped like a box with 6 flat faces. What shape is it?

6) If school starts at 9 o'clock and the first period ends at half past 9, how much time has passed?

7) Kabir buys a tiffin box for ₹180 and a water bottle for ₹95. He has ₹300. Does he have enough? How much is left?

8) A ludo dice is shaped like a cube. How many flat faces does it have?

9) Riya's class ends at half past 12. If it started at 12 o'clock, how long was the class?

10) Sana has ₹64 and 25 paise. She spends ₹15 and 25 paise on a chocolate. How much does she have left?

Order these amounts from smallest to largest: ₹65, ₹410, ₹230. Compare hundreds first: ₹65 has no hundreds, ₹230 has 2, ₹410 has 4. So the order is ₹65, ₹230, ₹410.

1) Order these amounts from smallest to largest: ₹275, ₹120, ₹480, ₹95.

2) Order these times from earliest to latest in a school day: half past 11, 9 o'clock, 12 o'clock, half past 9.

- 3) No, that is 9 o'clock - the hour hand tells you the hour, and it is pointing at 9.
- 4) No, that is half past 6 - the hour hand between 6 and 7 with the minute hand at 6 means half past 6.
- 5) No, half past always has the minute hand at 6, not 12.
- 6) No, at 8 o'clock the hour hand points exactly at 8, not between two numbers.
- 7) No, that is 11 o'clock - the minute hand at 12 always means an exact hour, not half past.
- 8) No, at half past 3 the hour hand is between 3 and 4, not exactly at 3.
- 9) Yes, that is correctly read as half past 7.
- 10) No, that is 1 o'clock - the minute hand at 12 means an exact hour.

WHILE YOUR CHILD WORKS

- Real coins and notes make the money section far easier than numbers on paper - count out ₹120 and ₹45 by hand before adding them.
- For the clock questions, use an analogue clock or a printed clock face rather than a digital display, since Class 2 is learning hands, not digits.
- This sheet mixes three topics on purpose, the way a school test would - if one section is much weaker than the others, that names exactly where to focus next.
