WRITE THE ANSWER

HERE'S ONE DONE FOR YOU

$246 + 137$: ones first, $6 + 7 = 13$. That is 1 ten and 3 ones - write the 3, and carry the TEN into the tens column. Then $4 + 3 + 1 = 8$ tens. Then $2 + 1 = 3$ hundreds. Answer 383. Say 'carry one ten', not 'carry the one' - it is what makes the method make sense.

HERE'S ONE DONE FOR YOU

452 - 138: ones first, 2 - 8 cannot be done, so borrow. Take one ten from the 5 tens, leaving 4 tens, and add it to the ones: 12 - 8 = 4. Then 4 - 3 = 1 ten. Then 4 - 1 = 3 hundreds. Answer 314. Borrowing across a zero (700 - 246) is the hard case - borrow from the hundreds first, then the tens.

HERE'S ONE DONE FOR YOU

'In all', 'altogether' and 'bought more' usually mean add. 'Left', 'still to', 'sold' and 'how many more' usually mean subtract. Read the question twice and decide which it is BEFORE writing any numbers - most word-problem mistakes are choosing the wrong operation, not calculating wrongly.

1) A school has 348 boys and 276 girls. How many children in all?

2) A shopkeeper had 500 eggs and sold 237. How many are left?

3) Ravi read 128 pages of a 350-page book. How many pages are still to read?

4) A library had 465 books and bought 189 more. How many books now?

5) A bus carried 236 passengers in the morning and 487 in the evening. How many in all?

6) A farmer had 814 mangoes and 359 were sold. How many are left?

7) A cricket ground had 175 people, then 268 more came in. How many people now?

WHILE YOUR CHILD WORKS

- Say 'carry one ten' rather than 'carry the one'. It takes one extra word and it is the difference between a child who understands regrouping and one performing a ritual they cannot check.
- Subtraction across a zero ($700 - 246$) is the hardest case on this sheet by some distance. If everything else is fine and those go wrong, that is the specific thing to practise rather than the whole topic.
- For word problems, have your child say whether it is an adding or a subtracting question before touching the numbers. Most errors here are choosing wrong, not calculating wrong.
